Advancing the Community Health Worker workforce in Atlanta will help address health equity gaps, costs, quality, and access needs affected by social determinants.

Community health workers have the unique ability to bridge the gap between communities, social services, and health care systems to improve delivery of care and increase access to services. Growing evidence demonstrates the positive impact of CHWs on improving health outcomes and reducing healthcare costs.

The program will focus on core competencies for CHWs and Public Health focusing on health equity and social determinants of health, evidence-based core competences for public health, including emergency response education, prevention, treatment, and vaccine hesitancy research.
